MANUAL AND RULES OF THE CAMPER

To keep things running smoothly we count on your cooperation with no visitors/events/parties/meetings/pets without prior approval, taking off your shoes, only flush toilet paper, not smoking inside or use of illegal drugs, only eating in the kitchen/dining area, disposing of open food/drinks before leaving, taking out your garbage to the trash can under the breezeway between the houses, wash the dishes you use, and putting your dirty linens in the bathroom tub before you leave. These things, along with the others below, allow us to not increase our rates and afford a better transition from guest to guest. By booking with us, you agreed that we reserve the right to charge fees/repair costs associated with any of our rules not being followed.

- 1. The TV has its own Roku remote that controls the TV power, volume, and channels. Also included is access to Netflix, Amazon Prime, Disney+, Hulu, local Spectrum cable TV, and other accounts for you to use. Please do not change the accounts to your own account info! You are welcome to add your account to any service that is not already logged in.
- 2. Feel free to walk or hike our 23+ acres of land. Please stick to the trails. A map is in the back of this binder that you can take a photo of for easy reference. We appreciate you leaving the land better than you found it. You are also welcome to use the play area, picnic tables, lawn chairs, tables, and fire pits located around the property.
- 3. Any snacks or food items are for you to enjoy, help yourself. Before you leave, please dispose of any food/drinks that you opened. Fresh eggs from our free-range cage-free hens were put in the refrigerator, just prior to your arrival. The honey on the counter is from our apiary right on the property. Contact us to purchase more.

We ask that you refrain from eating in the bedrooms. Food crumbs make a mess, are hard to clean up, and attract pests.

- 4. Extras: You can find extra towels, linens in the closets/dressers. There are toiletries under the bathroom sink. Cleaning supplies, garbage bags, and a fire extinguisher are in the closet across from the bathroom. A first-aid kit can be found in the kitchen above the TV. Please let us know if anything is missing or in low/short supply so that we can address it.
- 5. There is a **trash** can in the front of The Lodge under the breezeway. Please **BAG UP** and **dispose of your garbage** as needed. Please bag up your **recyclables and sit it on the ground next to the trash can**.
- 6. Please wash the dishes that you use, and if you have time, put them away after they are dry.
- 7. At the end of your stay, please put **dirty linens and towels** in the bathroom tub. Please leave comforters and blankets on the beds. We wash those in our large home washer.
- 8. The upstairs primary heating and cooling HVAC controls are on the wall by the bathroom. You can adjust which forced air vent the air conditioning comes out of by opening and closing the vent on the A/C panel in the ceiling in the kitchen. Please make sure that all doors and windows are shut when you have the heat or air conditioning on.
- 9. We want to keep our property quaint and quiet, as much as possible. Quiet time starts at 10pm and runs until the sun comes back up. We do not allow anyone on the property other than the number of individuals booked. Any visitors that are not included in the number of nightly guests booked will need to be approved by us well in advance prior to their arrival. There is no guarantee that we will give approval. If approval is granted there is a \$10 per-person perday fee for those guests on the property but not spending the night.

We do not allow events, parties, or meetings without approval PRIOR to booking. By booking with us, you agreed that we have the right to inspect the number of guests present during

the night or day. For these types of activities, parking logistics need to be arranged – as well, extra water, electricity, and propane/pellets are used – plus, we need to put extra time into getting The Lodge ready and cleanup takes longer, after large events are over.

You agree to approve any additional guest fees after your stay is complete. If needed, please make sure to adjust your guest count accordingly. Due to people trying to sneak guest in and have parties without approval we unfortunately had to implement a \$500 flat fee plus \$25 per person fee, over the booked number, for not abiding by this rule.

- 10. **We do not allow pets**, without approval PRIOR to booking. If you brought a pet with you and did not get prior approval from us, please let us know immediately. A \$500 flat fee plus \$25 per pet fee will be assessed for not abiding by this rule.
- 11. We do not allow smoking of ANY type (to include weed, vapes, cigars, or cigarettes) inside of The Lodge. Please also refrain from smoking in the doorways. We have guests that are sensitive to the smell of smoke. As well, the tar in these products stain and the smell can permeate furniture and linens. If you must smoke, please do so outside and dispose of your extinguished buts in a garbage bag, NOT on the ground or the can in front of The Lodge.

NOTE: Cannabis/Marijuana is federally illegal and not allowed on our property! If we smell weed, your stay will be terminated immediately!

12. Do not flush feminine products or anything other than toilet paper, down the toilet, as we have a septic system. Water damage to the floor and camper can be caused from the toilet overflowing due to being clogged. As well, the leach field can be damaged due to putting anything in the toilet that is not biodegradable. You will be responsible for water damage and/or repairs to our plumbing or septic system if incurred.

- 13. Please take your shoes off at the entry door. Stones caught in your shoes damage the floors. You are on a farm where chickens roam free. Tracking in mud, dirt, and other things will soil the carpets. Professional carpet cleaning is expensive and the cost to replace carpets is even more costly. We would hate to have to close The Camper to clean/replace any flooring. Lost revenue, material, and labor costs will be passed on to you. Thank you for taking off your shoes at the door.
- 14. **Please turn off the lights** when you leave the room. If you are temporarily heading out for dinner or other tasks, please turn off the lights.
- 15. **Do not use the grill under the awing, close to the camper, or furniture.** If you use the grill, please make sure to shut off the propane and clean it and the utensils when done. Grill utensils can be found in the kitchen or at the grill. If the propane is low or out or if anything is missing or needs attention, please let us know.

HOT TUB SPA RULES

- 1. HOT TUB HOURS are from 8am-10pm. PLEASE ASK US TO OPEN THE HOT TUB, if it is not already open. Send a message to us when you are done so we can close it up, to keep it clean.
- SHOWER OR BATHE BEFORE and do not have on your body any cosmetics, dirt, sweat, lotions, creams, or suntan/block!
- 3. DO NOT ADD ANY TYPES OF SOAPS OR BUBBLE BATH!
- 4. NO FOOD, DRINKS, OR ANIMALS/PETS in the hot tub!
- 5. Do not introduce **bodily fluids** into the hot tub and do not enter if you are **feeling ill**, have **diarrhea**, been **vomiting**, are **medicated**, have consumed **alcohol**, or have a **communicable disease**.
- 6. No diving, jumping, horseplay, or fighting in the hot tub.
- 7. Keep the water in the hot tub. No more than nine (9) people are allowed in the hot tub at one time. If water is overflowing the sides, please lower the number.
- 8. Children should only be in the hot tub with an adult present and no children under five (5) years old should be in the hot tub.
- 9. Do not swallow hot tub water or get it in your mouth.
- 10. Those with high blood pressure, heart disease, diabetes, or that are pregnant as well as those with seizure, heart, or circulatory problems should consult with their physician prior to entering the hot tub.
- 11. The host is **not responsible for injuries**. Guests will be required to **pay for missing items**, **damages**, **and the time and costs** incurred due to not adhering to the above rules to include, but not limited to, replacing the **water**, **chemicals** and the **inconvenience** to other guests who can't use the hot tub.

PLAYGROUND RULES

- 1. USE OF PLAYGROUND IS AT YOUR OWN RISK.
- 2. All children must always have adult supervision PRESENT with eyes on them.
- 3. Do not use play equipment if wet, too hot, or cold.
- 4. Please wear proper footwear. No bare feet except for when on the trampoline.
- 5. No running, rough play, hitting, pushing, or shoving.
- 6. Do not climb on the top of play equipment.
- 7. Please do not move the large playground items.
- 8. If you take chairs or smaller items out of the playground, please return them when done using them.
- 9. The host is **not responsible for injuries** and guests will be required to **pay for missing items and damages** incurred due to not adhering to the above rules.

TRAMPOLINE RULES

- 1. USE OF THE TRAMPOLINE IS AT YOUR OWN RISK.
- 2. No shoes, pets, toys, food, or drinks.
- 3. No more than **ONE (1) person at a time**.
- 4. 200lb weight capacity max, per manufacturer.
- 5. Do not use, if wet, icy, or snow covered.
- 6. All children must always have adult supervision PRESENT with eyes on them.
- 7. No children under five (5) years of age allowed.
- 8. No acrobatics, gymnastics, or stunts such as summersaults or flips. Paralysis or death can result if you land on your head or neck.
- 9. Do not bounce off, grab, lean on, or hang on the safety netting or vertical bars.
- 10. Do not use if you are **pregnant**, **feeling ill**, on **medication**, or under the influence of **alcohol**.
- 11. Do zip the door closed while in use.
- 12. The host is **not responsible for injuries** and guests will be required to **pay for missing items and damages** incurred due to not adhering to the above rules.

POND RULES

- 1. USE OF POND, BOATS, ETC. IS AT YOUR OWN RISK.
- 2. Adults should not swim alone, and all children must always have **adult supervision PRESENT** with eyes on them.
- 3. Do not go into the water if you are feeling ill, on medication, are under the influence of alcohol, or have a communicable disease.
- 4. Toddlers must wear swim-proof diapers.
- 5. No glass allowed at/in the pond or on the beach.
- 6. No animals or pets allowed in/on the pond, boats, or dock.
- 7. No running, rough play, hitting, pushing, or shoving.
- 8. Diving is allowed off the dock end or at deep end banks.
- 9. Everyone **boating** MUST wear a **life jacket**. Life jackets can be found in the bin to the right. **Do not stand up** in the boat while offshore or it could rock and capsize.
- 10. Catch and release fishing is only allowed if you have a New York fishing license. Contact Matt to purchase a license and/or rent fishing equipment.
- 11. **Fish food** can be purchased for a quarter at the vending machine under the breezeway between the two houses. Please only feed them this food.
- 12. The host is **not responsible for injuries** and guests will be required to **pay for missing items and damages** incurred due to not adhering to the above rules.
